This can sit alongside *Aotearoa* and *Wildlife of Aotearoa* (his other beautiful illustrated non-fiction books), but takes a more narrative approach, and includes breakouts and captioned details in the illustrations. It is also a wider, squarer format.

Throughout the narrative, Gavin deftly weaves in contemporary tikanga, demonstrating both their spiritual origin and their close relationship to science and the natural environment, as well as historical detail about pre-colonial Māori life. This makes it a brilliant book for teachers and students, applicable to numerous curriculum strands.



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
