

THE JUDY NUNN SHORT STORY COMPETITION

This short story competition, run by Penguin Random House Australia Pty Ltd (Penguin Random House Australia), commences on 11 November 2024 at 12.00 AM AEST and concludes on 5 December 2024 at 11.59 PM AEST. The prize for the competition is for A\$1,000.

HOW TO ENTER

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Who can enter?

2. Entry is open to Australian residents.
3. Entrants aged under 18 years must obtain the consent and agreement of their parent or legal guardian to enter this competition and be bound by these Conditions of Entry.
4. Employees (and their immediate families) of Penguin Random House Australia, are not eligible to enter.

What are the conditions of entry?

5. Entries must be received by Penguin Random House Australia during the Competition Period.
6. Entrants may enter this competition only once. Any subsequent entry from an entrant will be deemed invalid.
7. Entrants may enter this competition only in their own name. Entries with incorrect, misleading or fraudulent information will be deemed invalid.
8. If requested by Penguin Random House Australia, the entrant must produce photo identification or other document until Penguin Random House Australia is satisfied of the entrant's identity, age, residential address and eligibility to enter this competition.
9. Only completed works of fiction (up to 5,000 words) will be accepted.
10. Each entrant warrants that:
 - a. the work is an original literary work;
 - b. the entrant is the sole author of the work and no part of the work is created, or derived from works, using artificial intelligence technologies;
 - c. the entrant has not granted, transferred or assigned any of the rights, or interests in the rights, in the work to any third party;
 - d. the work has not been published, or currently under discussion with any other publisher, anywhere in the world;
 - e. all representations by the entrant as to the work being fiction are true and correct;
 - f. no part of the work infringes any intellectual property right (including, without limitation, copyright, moral rights or trade mark) of any third party; and
 - g. no part of the work breaches any privacy or confidentiality obligations.

11. Each entrant grants Penguin Random House Australia a non-exclusive, royalty-free, irrevocable, world-wide right to use the copyright subsisting in the work to conduct this competition.

How will the winner be selected and prize be awarded?

13. Judging of entries will take place by Judy Nunn and a panel of judges appointed by Penguin Random House Australia in December 2024. Entries will be judged based on literary merit of a standard set by Penguin Random House Australia at its discretion.
14. Penguin Random House Australia may elect not to determine a winner or award the prize if the panel of judges considers that no entry has met the literary standard set by Penguin Random House Australia.
15. If a winner is determined by the panel of judges, the winner be notified by email between 6 December 2024 and 15 December 2024, and the name of the winner will be announced on 20 December 2024.

What are the conditions of being awarded a prize?

16. The prize will only be awarded following verification of entrant eligibility as required by Penguin Random House Australia.
17. Penguin Random House Australia may forfeit the prize in respect of that winner and award the prize to another entrant whose entry is judged to be second best if:
 - a. no such response is received from the winner within 7 days of notification;
 - b. the winner refuses or is unable to accept the prize; or
 - c. there are eligibility or other verification issues relating to the winner.
18. The entrant, in the event of being announced the winner:
 - a. grants Penguin Random House Australia a non-exclusive, royalty-free, irrevocable, worldwide right to reproduce an extract of the work (up to 2,000 words), including reproducing the extract on the Penguin Random House Australia website, in connection with this competition;
 - b. grants Penguin Random House Australia the first option of publishing the work and, if the option is exercised, agrees to exclusively negotiate in good faith a publishing agreement on fair and reasonable market terms for a period of 12 weeks from the end of the prize being awarded;
 - c. if a publishing agreement is not entered into within the 12-week negotiation period, agrees to allow Penguin Random House Australia to offer a publishing agreement on the same or better terms as the terms that the entrant intends to accept from another publisher; and
 - d. agrees to treat the cash prize component of the prize, under any publishing agreement relating to the work, as an advance against any royalties from the publication and sale by Penguin Random House Australia of the work.
19. The entrant agrees that, in the event of being announced a winner, the entrant will participate in all reasonable promotional activities relating to this competition as requested by Penguin Random House Australia.
